THE RICHEST OF CLERGYMEN Dean Hoffman Worth Many Millions of Dollars.

Head of the Union Theological Seminary in New York. When a Pastor He Founded the First Workingmen's Club in America.

At seventy Rev. Eugene Augustus Hoffman, D. D., multi-millionaire and richest clergyman in America, if not in the world, is a busy, shrewd, clever man, says the Boston Globe.

How THEY DID IT. "How did we conduct the St. Mark's club? In the simplest manner possible. To begin with we didn't talk too much religion to the members, and we didn't worry them much about going to church. We asked them to pay 25 cents a month for their privileges, and having furnished them with various means of comfort and amusement in return for this charge, let them do about as they pleased, within certain limitations.

THE CLERGYMAN NEEDED. Dr. Hoffman retained pastor of St. Mark's till 1879. In his ten years' service he had become personally acquainted with some member of each of the nearly 1,000 families in the parish.
